Web Mail - Contacts Edit fails to hold change of e-mail address.

Service is Hotmail/Live Mail/Outlook/Outlook.Office365

If the edit of the entry fails, try deleting it, ensure that the change is saved and exit the address book.

Reopen the address book and add the entry, ensure that the addition is saved.

PDF files - Open in MS Word

While MS Word can open PDF documents it may not be the most appropriate tool.

Linux Mint has a document viewer with limited capability.

A proper program is a better option.

In Windows I suggest the use of FoxitReader, which also provides an online service to convert a PDF to MS Word format.

simple solution to tools>accountsettings>account>composition&addressi ng and UNtick the box that specifies composing in HTML. However, by default, Thunderbird always sends in plain text unless a style has been changed. For example, if you highlight and set any text to bold or italics or underline or change font size from composition window or color - or if, tools>settings>composition, you set a font other than 'variable length' or a font size other than medium. OR, if you sometimes write html, but specifically want to ensure a specific email is sent plain text, the press shift key when you click the Write button.

Two Factor Authentication

Introduction

A recent unsuccessful fraud attempt on my online checking account made me aware of the need for improved security when using online accounts. Many websites today offer Two Factor Authentication, or 2FA, to enhance login security. This article will provide an overview of 2FA, its various methods, and its significance in safeguarding online accounts.

What is Two-Factor Authentication?

Two-Factor Authentication, or 2FA, is an additional security measure offered by many websites to enhance the security of the login process. You provide your username and password; you also need to respond with a 2FA multiple-digit (often 6-digit) code number to access your online account. The 2FA code number may be sent to you by email or sent to or calculated on your cell phone. While 2FA is often used for online banking, many websites offer 2FA today for increased log-in security. Some websites *require* that you use 2FA.

Email 2FA

Email 2FA is one common type of 2FA used today. You must first save your email address on the website and enable the site's Email 2FA. After entering your username and password, the website sends you an email with a multi-digit security code when you log in to the website account. You note the numeric code in the email and enter it into the text box on the website account log-in screen. Press ENTER, and you will be securely logged in.

If using Email 2FA, that email's displayed security code can be read on your computer or cell phone. However, reading the email on your computer eliminates the advantage of needing two devices for increased security.

Text Message 2FA

Text Message 2FA is another common type of 2FA used today. You must first save your cell phone number on the website and enable the site's Text Message 2FA. During login to the website account, after entering your username and password, the website sends an SMS (Simple Message System) text message with a multi-digit security code to your cell phone. You note the numeric code in the text message and enter it into the text box on the website account log-in screen. Press ENTER, and you will be securely logged in.

Authenticator 2FA Apps

While Email 2FA and Text Message 2FA are most common, there is another 2FA method that uses an Authenticator cell phone software application or app. "Google Authenticator" and "Microsoft Authenticator" are free and are popular examples of cell phone Authenticator apps. Authenticator apps do not require a cell phone network connection and use the phone's clock time to calculate a 6-digit security code that changes every 10 to 30 seconds.

After entering your username and password, the website displays a text box for the security code when you log in to your website account. Look at the Authenticator app on your cell phone, identify the website's name on its list, and note its current numeric code. Enter the code into the text box on the website account log-in screen. Press ENTER, and you will be securely logged in. If you wait too long and the app 2FA code changes, you can enter it again. When using Authenticator 2FA, you do not wait for an email or phone text message.

Cell phones are ubiquitous today, but we all worry about misplacing or losing our phones. All Authenticator apps have procedures in place should you lose or replace your cell phone.

Syncing Authenticator Apps with Websites

Authenticator apps require some setup for each website, as the security codes for many websites can be shown when you start your one Authenticator app. After enabling the website's Authenticator 2FA, a QR code will be displayed on your computer. Start Authenticator on your cell phone and click "+" or "Add." Authenticator will then use your cell phone camera to view the QR Code displayed on your computer and add that website name to your app's list of synced websites.

The QR Code from the website provides the "seed" value your Authenticator app uses to calculate the authentication code unique to your log-in at that website.

Each Authenticator security code is unique to one individual and the website being logged into. Starting Google Authenticator on your cell phone will show a list of websites you have synced Authenticator to; each listed website will display a different, unique authentication code, all changing every 10 to 30 seconds. Other Authenticator apps will have a similar feature. This website-code-uniqueness is accomplished when you sync your Authenticator app with the website log-in; this syncing is done only once when you first enable Authenticator 2FA on the website.

Enhanced Security Using Multiple Devices

Requiring the use of two physical devices for website login improves security. Hence, 2FA systems that require both a computer and a cell phone are safer than those using only a computer. Google Authenticator is available only as a cell phone app, so Text Message 2FA requires two devices for secure login.

Note that Text Message 2FA and Authenticator 2FA require you to use your cell phone to provide a code to complete login to a website. If using Text Message 2FA, the website will send an SMS text message to your cell phone. If using Authenticator 2FA, your cell phone app generates the security code, and no cell phone call or message is used. Yes, it is more work to sign on to a website using 2FA, but it is more secure because presumably only you have your computer and cell phone, and your cell phone itself has a security code to view its screens.

OR Codes

QR Codes are increasingly used for many data com purposes today. QR Codes are two-dimensional square arrays of square black and white dots. QR codes can carry an astonishing amount of information, but as described here, the QR Code is displayed on your computer by the website 2FA set-up screen to sync your Authenticator cell phone app. This syncing is required only once. There are other systems of 2D graphic symbols, notably in Europe, where colored round dot symbols are seen, but here QR Codes dominate.

Other Login Security Systems

There are security systems that use a thumb drive dongle. That is a single-purpose, additional device that can even provide encryption but that must be kept on hand, requires a USB slot, and is less convenient.

In Europe, some banks supply a small hardware device that connects to your computer for 2FA; this 2FA system is more complex. The hardware device has a slot to plug in a chip-enabled card (like a credit or debit card), and it also includes a camera to view a 2D graphic code (it could be a QR Code or another kind of graphic code) on your computer screen. Every site using this system thus uses additional hardware, a credit-card-like card you retain, and also uses a 2D graphic code displayed on your computer for *every* website login. Surprisingly, username and password may not be used. However, logging in with this system takes more actions by users.

PayPal Secure Login

I use PayPal extensively for payments online because it does not reveal my credit card number. PayPal apparently has offered Text Message 2FA in the past and supports it now if it was enabled, but new 2FA implementations at PayPal require using an Authenticator app on your cell phone. So, for added log-in security at PayPal, I downloaded the free Google Authenticator app to my Android cell phone. The synching process went smoothly, and I now have better security logging into PayPal.

Conclusion

While using any 2FA adds some steps to account login and may seem inconvenient, it does increase the security when you log in to websites that can perform some financial transactions. Please realize that no login method is perfectly secure, and it is up to you to securely maintain your secure passwords and cell phone. Most fraud occurs from international locations that lack access to your cell phone, so 2FA serves as a valuable additional security measure to protect your online accounts.

Rick's Tech Tips – delete unwanted networks from your Chromebook

Question from Mitchell: Love your site, Rick. I have a question for you if you don't mind.

I recently retired from a job that required me to travel frequently to multiple states.

As you can imagine, I stayed in a lot of different hotels and now my Chromebook has a long list of WiFi networks that pop up when I go to connect to a network.

Since I'm not traveling anymore I'll never need to connect to most of those networks again. How can I remove them?

Rick's answer: This is a common issue for frequent travelers, Mitchell.

Chromebooks do a great job at storing WiFi networks that you'll need to connect to again in the future, but it does get tedious when you have to scroll through a bunch of them that you no longer have a need for.

Luckily, it's very easy to delete those unwanted networks from your Chromebook. Just follow the steps below:

- 1 Sign in to your Chromebook. 2 — Click on the Time display in the lower-right corner of the screen. 3 — Click the Settings icon (it looks like a "gear" or "cog").
- 4 In the left-hand pane, click Network. 5 — In the right-hand pane, click Wi-Fi, then select Known networks.
- 6 Find the network you want to forget and click the three vertical dots.
 7 Click Forget.
- 8 Repeat steps 6 and 7 for each of the other networks you want your Chromebook to forget.

That's all there is to it. From now on the networks you removed will no longer show up in your list of saved WiFi networks.

Note: If you ever visit one of those hotels again you'll still be able to connect to their WiFi network because it'll show up in the list of available networks (if you are in range, of course).
