At the meeting I noted that my previous advice that my desktop had locked at Windows 23H2 and would not update to 25H2; Windows had made the computer redundant and there was no support for Windows 11 as of last November. No talk about extensions similar to the Windows 10 close off.

Recently I went to the manufacturer's site to see if they had any updates. Nothing.

I then looked at the BIOS setting, ran backwards and forwards to see if there was any settings that would work.

I then checked the BIOS and found there was a later version. So, I downloaded it and holding my breath I run the update.

HOWEVER, there was no change and windows would not update any further.

Low and Behold, some months later out of the blue there was an update available for Windows 11 24H2. I ran it and it updated the computer to the later version. ## Q&A - February meeting

### Device Batteries

There was a time when devices had replaceable batteries.

Not so now, in fact some have a battery, which consists of a number of modules installed on various locations on the PCB.

If you can access the inside of the device replacement of the battery will not be easy, assuming that a replacement module/modules can be bought.

We really need Right to Repair and Reparability legislation from the federal Government.

Should a device be left out of use for some time and won't start the battery is probably discharged/flat, in some cases connecting the charger is of no immediate benefit as it may be necessary to wait for sufficient charge to accumulate before starting is possible.

Phones, Tablets etc. never actually turn off, they go into Standby mode and there is a small constant drain on the battery from the clock etc.

Avoid leaving anything with a battery in a hot location. It is detrimental for the battery and with a lithium one is likely to cause thermal runaway which can lead to fire releasing noxious gas which can be hard to extinguish.

### Ex Quicken XLS Missing Qty Numerals

I stopped using Quicken because my copy had an undocumented time bomb in it. After ten years it would no longer work and the Australianised Version was no longer available.

I was able to run it by changing the system date. The data was exported in three formats (PDF, TXT and XLS) as it was uncertain as to which format would be required for import into a replacement.

Recent reading of the XLS files revealed that the first line of the quantity parameter was corrupt - only the first numeral of the number had been recorded.

Fortunately the other file formats were OK so the XLS files could be corrected.

In similar situations verify the output by proof reading.
